

High-grade Kyrgyz gold for Kentor

KENTOR Gold has reported further high-grade gold results from its Savoyardy joint venture in the Kyrgyz Republic.

The best results received were 1m at 21.4 grams per tonne gold from 80m, 7m at 6.3gpt gold from 102.4m, and 1m at 10.3gpt gold from 91m.

The best intercept from Savoyardy is 15m at 14.2 grams per tonne gold from 21m including 2m at 43.9gpt, announced in December.

Diamond drill rigs have completed 28 holes of a 43-hole drill program to test the mineralisation to the south of the main Savoyardy mineralisation.

The Savoyardy project is adjacent to and along strike from Majestic Gold Corporation's Sawayerdun Project in the Xinjiang Province of China, which has a recently announced resource of 1.5 million ounces of gold.

Melbourne-based Kentor is earning a 70% interest in the Savoyardy project from fellow Kyrgyz gold explorer, Manas Resources, by spending \$US6 million (\$A7.2 million) on the project before 2012.
